Specimen impression of stamps used for the issue of movement certificate EUR 1 and EUR-MED



Above you find a specimen impression of the stamps used by the Icelandic customs authority for the endorsement of movement certificate EUR 1 and EUR-MED. The layout displayed is used for stamps throughout the country, but the stamp numbers identify the various customs offices in different regions of the country. Thus, the number "1" appearing in the stamp is just an example. The 19 different Icelandic stamp numbers in use are listed below.

Specimen impression of the stamps used for the issue of movement certificates EUR 1 and EUR-MED



Above you find specimen impressions of stamp used by the Norwegian customs authority when endorsing movement certificates EUR.1 and EUR-MED for Norwegian exporters. It should be added that all customs offices in Norway are authorised to stamp (endorse) movement certificates EUR.1 and EUR-MED upon exportation of originating products to a partner country. The customs stamps to be used have the same layout throughout the country; however, the code number varies, identifying the different customs offices. Thus, the numbers "1601" and "Oslo no. 12" appearing in the stamps are just examples.

#### Electronic EUR.1

Norwegian Customs introduced electronic EUR.1 on 2 April 2020. Below is a specimen impression of the red box located on the bottom left and upper right side of the certificate with the unique reference number and the date and time of issuance.

Specimen impression of the stamps used for the issue of movement certificates EUR 1

The following specimen impressions of the stamps are used by the Federal Office for Customs and Border Security for the endorsement of movement certificates EUR 1 and EUR-MED.



Concerning the name and code-number of the customs office and the number of the stamp the layout of the different stamps used may vary. Furthermore, the Swiss Cross is placed on the left-hand side of the word "ZOLLAMT" (German language, example 1) and "ZOLL" (German language, example 5) respectively on the right-hand side of the word "DOUANE" (French language, example 2) and "DOGANA" (Italian language, example 3). The stamps of the two District Directorates of Basel and Geneva do not have a Swiss Cross (examples 4 and 6)




2. No spaces must be left between the items entered on the certificate and each item must be preceded by an item number. A horizontal line must be drawn immediately below the last item. Any unused space must be struck in such a manner as to make any later additions impossible.
3. Goods must be described in accordance with commercial practice and with sufficient detail to enable them to be identified.
