

Great Jones Repertory Company is an intergenerational ensemble of diverse artists, pioneering new forms of storytelling through radical physicality, voice, and movement. Since our founding, our work has sought to embody and realize the vision of La MaMa's late founder, Ms. Ellen Stewart: to create a theatre of the world, within a creative home for artists and audiences of all identities, races, ages, and cultures. For over half a century, more than 100 performers, designers, musicians, and artists from around the world have called GJRC home; and our landmark, Obie Award-winning works remain a significant part of La MaMa's history.

CultureHub is an award-winning global art and technology community that builds on the 63-year legacy of our founding partners, La MaMa Experimental Theatre Club in New York City and the Seoul Institute of the Arts in Korea. Since 2009, CultureHub has explored the critical role emerging technologies play in the future of artmaking. Through residencies, annual media arts festival, digital storytelling incubator, and free education programs, CultureHub has amplified the work of more than 1,000 artists. CultureHub supports work that takes risks, embraces new tools and methodologies, and pursues pressing social questions through a variety of media, including creative code, new media performance, interactive installation, e-textiles, and browser-based environments. By developing hybrid presentation models that bridge online and offline spaces, CultureHub has engaged audiences in all 50 states and over 100 countries. culturehub.org

Her work explores the connections between academia, policy and activism, identifying spaces where bottom-up and top-down interactions across different levels and actors produce transformative practices, policies, and spaces to address the inequalities underlying the causes of the forced displacement and the exclusion of migrants with precarious status. She also examines and participates in activism across borders through networks of migrant organizations, mutual aid, and memorial projects as a response and an alternative to existing policies and systems in the struggles for justice.

She specializes in research dedicated to the migratory experience, transnational identity, and refugee aid. For *Medea*, Billy has collaborated on Creative Producing, Online Script, Techno Dramaturgy, Gimbal Operator, Projection Design, and Video Production.

DeAndra Anthony (CultureHub) is the Technical Director at CultureHub in New York City where she works with artists and technologists to bring experimental ideas to life. DeAndra graduated from New York City College of Technology in Brooklyn with a degree in Lighting and Video. LiveLab Broadcaster (Online Experience Platform) is a browser based low-latency livestreaming platform that allows for real time interactions with online audiences. The open-source project is supported and used by CultureHub and NYU's Interactive Telecommunications Program. It has been used by CultureHub and La MaMa in the following productions: *Vital Signs* (2020), *Take 21* (2022), *A Few Deep Breaths* (2022), *Fractals of Prometheus* (2023), and *Downtown Variety Ukraine Edition* (2023).
