Welcome Race Fans to the Five Star Liquor Stratford Speedway for our Fireworks Spectacular event. After our first two attempts at racing being rained out, we're going to have another go at getting the racing season underway and are hoping for better weather this time! Third time lucky?

Tonight's event is sponsored by Hinton Contracting. Daniel and the team at Hinton Contracting are your farm dairy effluent spreading and irrigation specialists. THOUSANDS OF HORSEPOWER IS SET TO BE RELEASED TONIGHT WHEN DRIVERS MASH THEIR ACCELERATOR PEDALS TO THE FLOOR AND LET THE DIRT FLY WHEN THEY TAKE TO THE TRACK FOR THE FIRST TIME THIS SEASON IN RACE MODE.

Arguably one of the most popular classes, the Michielsen's Transport Stockcars will race for their City of New Plymouth Classic trophy. These drivers always entertain with the rules allowing full contact meaning the drivers can settle any disputes on the track or have an effect on the outcome of the race results if they so desire.

Like the Stockcars, both the Superstock, Modified and Minisprint classes will also race for their City of New Plymouth Classic trophies. Who is going to be the fastest on the track for the first racing of the season to take the victory?

A mixed field of Saloons and Super Saloons will race along with the Youth Ministocks, where drivers will be split between seniors and those new to the sport who are still on the mentor program.

Although we don't have six national titles to run this season as we did last, we have an exciting calendar planned that includes the Lucas Oils Superstock Shootout Series, supported by Lloyd Gernhoefer Contracting and Bullitt Fabrication, the M.C Fale and Gibbons Contracting North Island Modified Championship, The Sentry Hill Motel West Coast Stockcar Teams Champs that will this season be run as a two night deal, New Zealand Minisprint Grand Prix while all your favourites such as Demolition Derbies, Under 23 Stockcar Champs, Demolition Derby Teams Champs and Taranaki Champs for all classes are all also back. Plus, after a couple of seasons not running, the Holiday Derby is scheduled again which will be sure to entertain with carnage aplenty as caravans, boats and even Portaloo's are destroyed during the race.





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# SPEEDWAY-101

#### SO YOU HAVE NEVER BEEN TO SPEEDWAY BEFORE,

well, you're in for a treat tonight. Stratford Speedway has been around for over fifty years with racing starting on this site way back in 1964. A variety of classes have raced throughout that time, some no longer exist while some have evolved into what you will see on the track tonight.

These days, nine different classes race at Stratford Speedway, with up to six of these racing on any given night. From time to time, other invitational classes will make an appearance while other feature events are held throughout the season including among other things, Demolition Derbies and Stockcar Soccer.



#### THE RACES:

The most common duration for race length is ten laps. Superstocks, Stockcars, Streetstocks and the Adult Ministocks all begin their race form a standing start at the start line which is in front of the grandstand. All the other classes – Modifieds, Midgets, Saloons, Minisprints and Youth Ministocks will start from a rolling start. The field will follow the pace ute around the track until it pulls off at turn two at which point the drivers know they are about to start. The lights will go green and the race starts coming off turn four.

The races may be stopped or slowed at any time due to crashes or incidents. Most classes will stop when the officials activate the red lights however the Modifieds, Midgets, Minisprints and Saloons don't run the red light and will slow when the yellow comes on. Competitors will circulate slowly until the race is restarted which will be done in a single file format.

#### RACE RADIOS:

All classes run these. Officials will communicate with drivers via the radios to advise them of impending red or yellow lights, to move to correct grid positions and so on. The radios are one way only and the competitors can't talk back to the officials.

## THE CLASSES



#### SUPERSTOCKS **W///// Repco**

Without doubt this is the premier contact class in New Zealand Speedway. The cars are fast, expensive, and heavy (weighing in at between 1400 and 1500 kg/s). Drivers are not only permitted to, but encouraged to hit each other (in their cars of course). The cars run a variety of engines but Nissan and Toyota V8's are the most popular at this point in time.



#### **STOCKCARS**

Looking just like the Superstocks, these cars have more restrictive rules in place to keep the cost down. The cars are still quick, still heavy and the drivers still like to hit each other, in fact more so than the Superstocks due to the lesser amount of money involved. Engines popular in this class include 6 cylinder Ford and Holden's, although almost every manufacturer can be found somewhere in the class.





#### MODIFIEDS



Wild things with big wings! Modifieds are a spectacular class. The cars run big tyres, big wings and big Methanol breathing engines that produce well over 600 horsepower. The wings on the cars help them to corner extremely efficiently and this makes for very fast and spectacular racing.



#### SALOONS

One of the few classes that on appearance resemble a road going car. However, closer inspection will reveal anything but. The cars run space framed pipe chassis, run mostly V8 engines running on Avgas and produce somewhere around the 500 horsepower mark.





#### SUPER SALOONS 🔀



At first glance, they may resemble a saloon, but unlike a traditional saloon, these vehicles run on methanol and feature adjustable suspension, larger rear tyres, and more powerful engines. They also boast a distinctive body shape, enhanced by the addition of a plastic wedge front clip nose cone that adds to their unique style.

# THE CLASSES



#### STREETSTOCKS

A budget racing class that is effectively road going cars altered into racing machines by removing windows, door cards, seats etc and installing a roll cage along with a few race parts. Holden commodores and Ford Falcons are particularly popular in this class. Light contact (tap and spin) is permitted.



#### YOUTH MINISTOCKS

A class for kids between the ages of twelve and sixteen to race in. The cars are similar in appearance to Superstocks and Stockcars but only run 1200cc Datsun and Toyota engines. Cars are built almost identically and run to strict racing rules with no contact permitted. The young drivers learn valuable car control skills before they even get their road license.





#### ADULT MINISTOCKS

Identical cars and rules to the Youth Ministocks but with no age restrictions. Good for new drivers on a budget to get out on the track and learn race craft.



#### ZOCIACIONE MINISPRINTS

Similar in appearance and size to the Midgets but running smaller engines and front and top wings. Although they have less power, the wings help the cars to corner and ensures that their lap times are on a par with the Midgets.




Speedway might look like an easy sport. The concept is simple, drive around an oval track as fast as you can to beat your opposition. However, there is a big difference to feeling fast and being fast. The setup of race cars is complex and varied with drivers forever honing their setup craft in pursuit of more speed. There has never being a truer saying than this one 'races are won in shed' and that is because it is the time spent maintaining, tuning, checking and setting cars that makes them quick on a small dirt oval.

From time to time in this program, we will discuss just one aspect of a speedway car in an effort to provide you, the spectator, with a little more insight in just what it takes to go fast.

This week Jarrod MacBeth, a former Ministock, Stockcar and current Saloon competitor has put pen to paper to write about tyres. Although he has a number of years' experience, Jarrod says that these are his opinions of his knowledge and may differ from other drivers.

Tyres, they're black, round and made of rubber so should be pretty simple right? Not quite. Tyres are one of the most critical parts of a race car. They are the only thing that connects your car to the track surface and can be one of the most expensive consumable parts.



No tyre will perform as good as a new tyre but for many drivers it is not possible to run new tyres all the time simply because of the cost. Ministock tyres are standard road tyres and can be purchased for as little as \$80. Stockcars also run road variations which can be cost effective for around \$100 but these are not the best option. The best road tyre option for a Stockcar to get maximum grip is a Cooper Cobra, retailing at around \$280. Superstocks run Hoosier tyres that are designed and built specifically for dirt tracks. These sit around the \$365 price point. As the tyres get bigger, they cost more. A Minisprint Hoosier or American Racer (Another brand of tyres built specifically for dirt) will set you back in excess of \$400 whilst Saloon, Super Saloon and Modified rears cost in excess of \$500. By the time you add a wheel and a centre, you can be getting close to \$\$1300 per rear corner on a Saloon or Mod!

So we've established that tyres are expensive and it is rare for a driver to run new every week so how do they get the most out of the tyres whilst keeping to a budget?



#### TYRE CYCLING

A driver may cycle their tyres, run new for the important meetings like regional championships and National titles, then pick the best of what they have for club championships and just run whatever on a night when they aren't racing for a trophy to use them up.

#### REGROOVING

Regrooving is not permitted in all classes, but where permitted drivers may re groove their tyres. This can add new life to used tyres by deepening and/or widening the tread. Drivers may also re-groove to remove the feathered edge on a tread block and give a sharp edge again which will bite into the track better. Some drivers will re-groove new tyres to make them work better. There are a lot of theories on how to groove and many drivers will have their own.

#### SIPING

Drivers may sipe their tyres. This will be done on new tyres too. Siping is the act of making razor thin cuts through the tread blocks which allows them to flex more and get up to race temperature faster. You need to be careful though as if your tyre heats up too fast, it can go beyond the optimum temperature point and go off, lessening grip in the very important later stages of a race.

#### **BUFFING**

After a tyre has been cycled (raced) it will tend to glaze over. A driver may buff their tyre by sanding or buffing to remove this glaze and provide optimum grip for the next race or event. New tyres may also be buffed to remove the wax that is used during manufacturing to release the tyre from the mould. An alternative to this is making the tyres spin on the track so if you see a driver deliberately spinning their tyres before the race start, this could be why.

#### **COMPOUNDS**

Tyres built specifically for dirt track racing (mostly Hooiser and American Racer) are generally available in different compounds too. Softer compounds are mostly used on a soft non-abrasive track with short races where as harder tyres are used on abrasive tracks and longer races so that they don't burn up or go off to quickly.

There you have it, a very brief run down on the black round rubbery things that sit between a drivers race car and the track surface they are racing on.
